On behalf of my company, Kartprix International P/L, I formally request to be recognised as an event promotor by the Australian Karting Association.


I plan to conduct a national kart racing series annually, commencing in 2008 for between 4 and 8 rounds. The series shall be known as the '*Kartprix Series*' and shall be conducted at circuits in states / territories across Australia. The series shall feature a main promotional class along with various support classes. The series shall be promoted and presented at a professional standard.

Previously, I was involved in the promotion of what was known as the CIK Series from 1996 to 2000 through my former business *KartOz Magazine*. This was of course a highly successful series that was the first Australian karting series to be broadcast regularly on national television in Australia, saw the highest levels ever of participation in the former CIK classes and saw large levels of media recognition in both the motorsport and general communities.

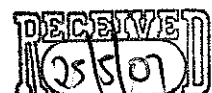
The 2008 series shall be conducted over 5 rounds at 5 dates that shall be put forward to the Australian Karting Association in an accompanying proposal.

Application for Kartprix Series Race Dates

On behalf of my company, Kartprix International P/L, I wish to apply for the following dates to be approved for the conduct of the 2008 Kartprix Series.

The Kartprix Series shall be conducted as a 'National Series' and therefore would have National Status pending approval by the Australian Karting Association. Each meeting shall be conducted over 2 days, either Saturday and Sunday or where possible Friday and Saturday with the finals under lights on Saturday night.

As outlined to the Australian Karting Association at the March 31 Forum, the Kartprix Series shall be conducted for a feature class in addition to selected support classes. The feature class shall be promoted for 16 professional racing teams of 2 karts per team, each team kart is to be presented identically and shall be of the same manufacturer.

At the aforementioned March 31 Sydney Forum, National Karting Council delegates expressed enthusiasm towards the series, yet recommended postponing any series in 2007 and plan the 2008 series instead. With this, I respectfully present the following dates:
