Stage 1 Introductory to Karting

Clubs responsibilities

Step 1

Any person who is involved with children on NSW is required by legislation to complete a Prohibited Working with Children Form.

Step 2

Arrange a suitable time with the parent or parents for a training session parents are required to attend the initial training school (allow a minimum time of about four hours).

Step 3

If the driver is unlicensed carry out the appropriate steps to issue a licence.

Step 4

Check Kart for compliance.

Instruction

- Advise Parents of their responsibilities.
- The Rule Book.
- Basic kart Set Up in accordance with manufacturers specifications.
- Test drive the driver for a number of laps.
- Give basic instruction on racing lines etc.
- Plenty of practice with appropriate instruction.
- Advice on basic tools required and general equipment required to go racing.
- Paper work required to participate at a race meeting.
- Do not over complicate the session as tends to confuse young drivers and parents.

Stage 2 Advanced Level

Any person who is involved with children on NSW is required by legislation to complete a Prohibited Working with Children Form.

Step 2

Investigate if there is a need in your area or zone for an advanced level training school for juniors if there is enough prospective juniors to conduct an advanced training school then advise neighboring clubs and the state office of your intention to conduct a training school for advanced juniors. It is suggested these schools be conducted regionally in attempt to keep costs to a minimum and avoid duplication within your region. Any AKA competition or social licence holder is eligible to enter.

KARTING NSW will conduct the following Junior Development days were possible:

Two day camp during the Christmas holidays in the Metropolitan area.

One development day during the Winter holidays or a Saturday during the winter term in the Northern Zone.

One development day during the Spring Holidays or a Saturday during the spring term in the Southern Zone.

Step 3

Send application forms to the state office and your neighboring clubs along with a program, entry form with a closing date of three weeks prior to the school. The document will have to include any details regarding costs to the participant and parents.

Step 4

No racing is permitted during the on track driver training.

Step 5

If you receive sufficient applicants and the school would have to be an overnight school arrange the catering and advise costs for over night accommodation for both the applicants and parents.

Step 6

Arrange your instructors along with their costs and were necessary their travel and accommodation arrangements.

Where practicable try and arrange for a professional instructor or a karter who is unbiased, is literate and capable in giving clear and concise instruction's, possibly a former state or national champion whom the juniors respect.

Instruction

- Advise Parents of their responsibilities.
- The Rule Book.
- Advanced kart Set Up in accordance with Track conditions and driver.
- Test drive the driver for a number of laps.
- Check drivers capabilities.
- Give instruction on racing lines etc.
- Check drivers lap times and instruct on further kart set up to improve race times.
- Instruct on gaining good starts.
- Plenty of practice with appropriate instruction.
- Advise on basic tools required and general equipment required to go racing.
- Paper work required to participate at a race meeting.
- Do not over complicate the session and keep sessions short and concise.
- Try and keep the numbers as near to a one on one situation as practicle.

Stage 3 Moving On

For an advanced level training school for juniors if there is enough prospective juniors to conduct an advanced training school then the state office will advise of their intention to conduct a training school for advanced juniors these are to be conducted annually. It is suggested these schools be conducted in the metropolitan area to utilise the facilities in the metropolitan area by doing this will Endeavour keep costs to a minimum (May we suggest that the prospective applicant have at least three years-racing experience and a full " B " Licence prior to this school).
