SERIES ENTRY:

Competitors who enter **ALL 3 ROUNDS PRIOR** to **close of entries for Round 1** will be entitled to a series entry rebate of \$45.

Entries will be opened for ALL rounds simultaneously. Competitors need to enter each round separately at each club prior to close of entries for Round 1 (Monday 12th February 2024 11.59pm). The normal entry fee will be charged.

Competitors will then receive a rebate of \$15 from each club once it is confirmed that they have entered all 3 rounds.





Any entries received after close of entries for Round 1 WILL NOT qualify for the Series Entry rebate.

The Series Entry is not eligible for any form of refund.

ENTRY FEE REFUNDS

The Entry Fee will be refunded in full if an entry is withdrawn prior to close of entries. The Entry Fee will only be refunded in exceptional circumstances if an entry is withdrawn after the close of entries.

This does not apply to Series Entries which are non-refundable.

OVERSUBSCRIBED ENTRIES:

There will be NO OVERSUBSCRIBED entries. Entries for each class will be accepted up to the track density on a "first in first served" basis.

MINIMUM ENTRIES:

The MINIMUM number of entries for each class will be 5 per class. If the minimum entries are not received by close of entries the class may not run.

Non-Starters (DNS) and non-finishers (DNF) will be awarded a finishing position (after all finishers) based on the number of laps completed.

In instances of a tie on laps, the driver with the lower grid position will be awarded the higher points.

Any driver excluded from a race (DSQ) will be awarded the highest points available for the class (based on the number of entries) plus 1 point.

In determining grids ties on points will be resolved in favour of the competitor with the fastest lap time from Heat 1 and Heat 2.

Finishing positions of the final only will determine the result of the event.

E. MEETING CONDITIONS





CONTROL FUEL:

Control Fuel will be used in this series. Control Fuel (Supreme 98) must be purchased from TBA. Control Fuel can be purchased from the Friday prior to the event. Receipt must be retained and be produced if requested.

ENGINE SEALING:

Each engine must be sealed in accordance with the Technical Regulations. Distribution will be advised in the event timetable. If a competitor damages or incorrectly fits a seal and requires it to be replaced the cost of the additional seal will be \$10.

TRANSPONDERS:

Compatible timing transponders must be fitted in accordance with the Technical Regulations T.3.14, **for all Practice, Qualifying, Heats and Finals.**

TYRES:

Tyre pooling will be used in all classes in this series for slick tyres. Competitors are required to purchase their dry weather tyres from the "tyre pool". The tyre pool will be controlled by Maxxis Tyres distributor (**St George Karts**) and the meeting scrutineers. Class collection times to be advised in the event timetable.

Competitors are to supply their own wet tyres.

NOSECONES:

Drop Down Nose Cones will not be used in this series.

F. PRIZES & AWARDS

ROUND PRIZES

For each round of the series class prizes will be awarded based on the finishing order of each individual Class based on the results of the Final only.

Awards will be presented to:

- $1^{st},\,2^{nd},\,3^{rd},\,4^{th}$ & 5^{th} for Novice & Rookie
- 1st, 2nd & 3rd for all other classes, in each Class at each Round.

SERIES POINTS & AWARDS

The Series classification in each Class will be based on the Drivers with the highest accumulated points gained in all races in all Rounds in the Series as per the below point score. It should be noted that the Finals will be awarded double points.

A Driver does not need to compete in all Rounds of the Series to be eligible for Series awards.

Should two (2) or more Drivers have equal points at the end of the series, the winner will be determined by a countback of the highest finishing positions in the final at each





of the 3 rounds. Should a tie still occur then the countback will go back to heat results.

G. CLUB/TRACK REQUIREMENTS

MEDICAL SERVICES:

RACE TRACK ENTRY:

Once Karts start moving and the Outgrid gate(s) are closed, there will be no further entry of Karts, persons or equipment to the Race Track, until the completion of practice/racing and all Karts are stopped.

CUT THROUGH:

The Cut-Through WILL be in use at the discretion of the Clerk of Course. Drivers will be notified of its use by signs at the Start/Finish Line and/or Flag Point 2. (Prior to turn 5). The Cut Through will primarily be used on the roll up immediately preceding the start and immediately following an aborted start.

KART RETRIEVAL:

Retrieval of Karts is at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.

Pit Crew must only enter the Race Track area when permitted by the Grid Marshall or Clerk of Course, and then only if wearing a HIGH VISIBILITY Safety Vest or Clothing on the upper torso.

ENGINE EXHAUST SEALING:

Competitors may be required to present their kart to the scrutineers with the necessary equipment and tools (including sealing nuts) to allow the restrictor to be checked and the exhaust sealed. SIKC will provide seals.

Any competitor who changes an engine during the event will be required to present their kart to the scrutineer for resealing of the restrictor.

ANIMALS:

Subject to the applicable laws which may govern the access of animals, no animals are allowed anywhere within the Track precinct, other than Registered Service Dogs.

OTHER:

No dumping of Fuel or Tyres, please make your own arrangements.

No smoking or use of E-cigarettes in the Race Track, Grids, Technical or Paddock areas

No unlicensed driving of motor vehicles permitted at the Track

No Kart engine starts any day before 7.30 am or during Drivers Briefing.

There is to be no moving of karts around the pit area with engines running.

Overnight camping Is Not permitted on the grounds.

Please keep the Ambulance gate/entrance clear at all times.

Competitors are not permitted to bring into the Complex any alcoholic beverage.
